A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer For the Week of the Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany January 28, 2024 through February 4, 2024

Catechesis Notes for the Week— The Power of Baptism Is in the Word and Promise of God. Baptism is not man's work; it is God's work. Baptism is not a symbol of a decision of a person's will to become a Christian; it is the action of God whereby He joins us to Christ and bestows upon us the salvation He won for us upon the cross. We know that Baptism is God's work—a Sacrament through which He bestows His grace—because of the Words and promises of God attached to Baptism. The Word makes it clear that Baptism has the power to save us from our sins. "Be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is to you and to your children, and to all who are afar off, as many as the Lord our God will call" (Acts 2:38-39). This passage makes it clear that baptism gives forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. That promise is for old and young alike, as the Scriptures make clear. "The promise is to you and to your children..." What a wonderful promise. All who believe the promises of God have exactly what the promises declare. This is the meaning of Mark 16:16, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned." By faith in the promises of God attached to the waters of Baptism, we receive "forgiveness of sins, rescue from death and the devil, and eternal salvation." Baptism is a source of great comfort and the ground of our assurance.

The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Pray and confess out loud as much from the order of meditation and prayer as you are able or as your family size and ages dictate. Learn by heart the verse, catechism, and hymn of the week.
